



Grounds & Facilities Criteria and Required Standards - by Division

As per League Management Rule 3.4, clubs are required to meet minimum standards in respect of Facilities, Ground Marks, Disciplinary Record and Administration. These requirements vary by Division and are set out in this document.

Administration				
Due Diligence: Each club must have a constitution and keep proper records of accounts. These should be available for inspection by the League if they deem it necessary.	M	M	M	M
Insurance: All clubs must be fully insured to include full public liability.	M	M	M	M

General Facilities				
Ground Availability: The ground that the relevant team plays on should be owned, leased, or subject to a long-term agreement, and must be available on all dates when fixtures are scheduled.	M	M	R	R
Pavilion: The club must have a pavilion to which there is full access on all league and cup match days. Facilities must not be restricted by other events.	M	M	M	M
Scoreboard: Clubs should have a dedicated scoreboard (electronic or manual) which is clearly visible from most of the ground. Portable scoreboard and table in public area for scorers is not acceptable unless dispensation is approved due to work on improvements etc	M	M	M	M

Scoreboard Detail: The numbers on the scoreboard should show at least: Total; Wickets; Overs Bowled or Overs Remaining; First Innings Total; and be of adequate size to be visible from the far side of the ground.	M	M	M	M

Changing Facilities				
Separate secure dressing rooms must be provided for home & away teams. Changing rooms should be easily accessible from the playing area whilst preserving the privacy of the players, and should allow viewing of the playing area whenever possible. The changing rooms should have adequate security facilities to ensure the security of equipment and possessions.	M	M	M	M
Adequate clean and hygienic showers with relevant maintenance regime should be available and conveniently located to allow private access by players and umpires.	M	M	M	R
Separate and secure accommodation must be provided for the umpires, of a similar standard to the players' dressing rooms.	M	M	M	R
Bowler's markers, umpires' coats, drying cloths, ordinary and heavy bails and spare stumps should be available.	M	M	R	R

Toilet Facilities				
Clubs must have separate toilet facilities for male & female spectators. Clean and hygienic toilet, washing and hand-drying facilities, adequately equipped (including mirrors) and serviced, must be available for both males and females.	M	M	M	R
Access for spectators must be consistent with the security and privacy requirements of players and umpires.	M	M	M	M
All facilities must meet legal requirements and should take account of the needs of the disabled.	M	M	M	M

Hospitality				
Clubs should have a dedicated area for match teas. This can be part of the bar, as long as it is exclusive at the time of tea for players, scorers, and match officials.	M	M	M	M
Teas and, if provided, lunches should be of a good standard.	M	M	M	M
Where applicable the bar and surrounding area should have adequate facilities for players, supporters and families, including proper heating and seating arrangements.	M	M	M	M
Where applicable the bar should be adequately staffed and open before the close of play. It is not mandatory to have bar facilities.	M	M	M	M
The area used for serving meals should be adjacent to the playing area, of adequate size to accommodate players, officials and a few spectators and in good clean decorative condition.	M	M	M	M

The kitchen must meet all legal health and safety requirements and provide hot and cold water, washing facilities, adequate worktops in clean and hygienic condition, suitable storage space including a refrigerator and sufficient crockery and cutlery in good condition.	M	M	M	M
There should be adequate spectator seating around the ground.	M	M	R	O
A seated area, ideally covered and sheltered, should be provided for the batting side to view the match.	M	M	R	R

Ground & Playing Surfaces				
Clubs are required to have a dedicated groundsman on hand during matches.	M	M	R	O
The square should be well maintained and in good condition with the whole of it being cut within two days of the start of each match.	M	M	M	M
The pitch should be clearly distinguishable from the remainder of the square and should be marked and rolled before play.	M	M	M	M
Stumps, which should be properly matched, in good condition and with matching bails, should be pitched by the groundsman with holes adequately watered to allow easy resetting by the umpires.	M	M	M	M
The pitch should be brushed and re-marked (and rolled if required) during the interval between innings.	M	M	M	M
At least one roller must be available for use during the match.	M	M	M	M
Any holes or ruts on the square caused by previous matches must be levelled, filled and firmed before a subsequent match.	M	M	M	M
The outfield must be well maintained and adequately drained.	M	M	M	M
The outfield must be closely mown with no noticeable grass cuttings.	M	M	M	M
Balls should be able to run true and the outfield should be free of holes, ruts or other obstructions that might pose a hazard to fielders.	M	M	M	M
The boundary should be clearly marked by rope or white line and with markers approximately 20 yards apart. (markers only necessary where there is a line, not necessary where a rope is provided). Alternatively, where a gutter is used the edge should be cleanly cut; if a picket fence or advertising boards form part or all of the boundary, they should be secure and in good condition.	M	M	M	M

Ground Surrounds				
The surrounds should be maintained by regular cutting.	M	M	M	M
Fences and walls should be well maintained.	M	M	M	M
The entrance(s) to the ground should be clearly signed, showing the name of the club.	M	M	R	R

Sightscreens				
Unless backgrounds are painted white, it is mandatory that sight screens should be of sufficient size to remove the need for movement whether the bowler is bowling over or round the wicket. Also, they must adequately provide full screening on one side of the wicket which does not require movement when bowlers and batters are alternating from right to left hand.	M	R	O	O
The structure and non-reflective paintwork of the sight screens should be in good condition. They should be of an adequate and appropriate size for the ground and should be completely outside the playing area whenever possible.	M	M	M	M
Screens are to be provided at both ends unless explicit dispensation is given by the League Management Board. Not applicable where backgrounds are of white in colour.	M	M	M	M

Covers, Drying Equipment & Rollers				
Wheeled covers are mandatory.	M	M	R	O
All covers must be available to protect the pitch and the bowlers' run-ups from rain both during the match and in the preceding days as appropriate.	M	M	R	O
The covers must protect an area of at least 80 feet by 12 feet and clubs are encouraged to protect a larger area, including the bowlers' run-ups, whenever possible	M	M	R	O
Grounds must have a 'water hog' or other adequate type of water removing apparatus.	M	M	R	O
An adequate supply of sawdust and cloths must be available to minimise lost playing time due to wet ground conditions.	M	M	M	M
Light (5 to 10 cwt) and heavy (minimum 30 cwt) rollers should be available for use on the pitch.	M	M	M	M
At least one roller must be available for use during the match.	M	M	M	M

Car Parking				
Every effort should be made to provide adequate car parking for players, officials and spectators either within the ground or immediately adjacent to the ground.	M	M	M	R
The approaches to the car park, and the car park area itself, should be suitably surfaced without potholes or other hazards.	M	M	M	M
Clubs should make suitable provision for disabled access to the ground and social areas.	M	M	M	M

Practice Facilities				
Clubs should ensure that they have access to good quality practice facilities for mid-week practice for senior players and either mid-week or weekend practice for junior players.	M	M	R	O
Net practice facilities should be available for use by both sides (ideally a minimum of two nets) before matches whenever possible.	M	R	O	O
